

ECB-EIOPA Workshop on "Policy options to reduce the climate insurance protection gap"

European Central Bank, Frankfurt, 22 May 2023 (hybrid format)

The ECB and EIOPA published a <u>Discussion Paper</u> on "Policy options to reduce the climate insurance protection gap". This paper does not reach firm conclusions on specific policies that need to be implemented. Rather, its aim is to solicit feedback on the possible policy actions set out.
