AEIP represents the social protection institutions jointly set up and managed by the Social Partners.</p> <p>Within the pension field, paritarian institutions are involved in both the managing of the first pillar and of the second pillar pensions, in accordance with the different European pension systems. AEIP members fall either under the IORP directive (2003/41/EC), Solvency II (2009/138/EC) or Regulation 883/04 on the coordination of social security systems.</p> <p>Mr. Gabellieri is also the Director of Communication & External Relations at Humanis, one of the biggest French Paritarian Group of Social Protection.</p> <p>Mr. Gabellieri is a French lawyer, and he defended his PhD on the subject of the French Paritarian Coordinated Retirement Schemes for Executives (AGIRC).</p> <p>He's also professor from a long time in various universities (Paris, Montpellier).</p> <p>In 2020, Bruno was elected Chair of the World Pension Alliance.</p>
