## Antonello Motroni

Antonello Motroni graduated in Economics and Business Studies at the University of Tuscia and then got a master's degree in Economics at the School of Economics, University of Rome Tor Vergata. From 2006 Antonello has been working for Mefop, Department of Economy and Finance and he chairs the Assoeuropea (advocacy association of pension funds) Working Group on EU policy issues. The representatives of the pension funds as well as those of the constitutive associations take part in the Working Group. The WG analyses the EU policies and their potential impact in Italy. The National Competent Authority, the representatives of the Ministry of Economy and Finance and of the Department of EU Affairs are regularly involved. The main issues on the agenda are PEPP, EIOPA Stress Testing, Sustainable Finance package, Iorp2, Emir, EU supervisory reporting.

Antonello represents Assoeuropea and its members in AEIP and PensionsEurope where he actively engages in various committees and working groups.

In Mefop Antonello is responsible for the Statistical activities. He is co-author of Working Papers presented at prominent academic events (International Institute of Public Finance, Italian Society of Public Economics). Antonello represented Mefop in the Working Group established by the National Competent Authority to define the framework of the current supervisory reporting. He is in the faculty of the Mefop-LUISS University master in "Economy, Finance and Governance of Institutional Investors".

Antonello decided to apply for the OPSG as adequate and sustainable pensions are one of the biggest challenges of the EU societies and is key for stakeholders to be strongly engaged in the search of suitable and affordable answers.
