The purpose of the processing of the trainees' personal data is the following: - To administer the trainees of the Agency,
- To define entitlements granted to the trainees.
EIOPA receives candidate applications through a dedicated e-recruitment tool ('Gestmax') maintained by an
external contractor as data processor. As part of the selection procedures EIOPA conducts remote written
tests. During the written examination the candidates are supervised by an external proctor. This invigilated
remote testing service is provided by an external contractor ('TestReach') as data processor (only for TA, CA and SNEs, call for traineeship does not include written test).

- withdraw their consent to the processing of their personal data at any time in case such processing is based solely on their consent.

For the protection of the data subjects' privacy and security, every reasonable step shall be taken to ensure that their identity is verified before granting access, or rectification, or deletion.
