

Pierpaolo Marano

Pierpaolo Marano is a Professor of Insurance law and regulation at the Catholic University of the Sacred Heart – Milan and the University of Latvia. Professor Marano holds a PhD in Banking law and regulation from the University of Siena. He is a scholar in residence at the University of Connecticut, School of law – Insurance Law Center, an Affiliate Faculty at the Department of Insurance of the University of Malta, and an Honorary Fellow at the University of Hong Kong – Asian Institute of International Financial Law. A widely sought writer and speaker on insurance law and regulation and one of the drafters of the Italian Code of Private Insurance, Pierpaolo Marano is the author of two monographs, co-editor of ten books, and author of over 100 academic papers on insurance law and regulation, corporate law, banking law and bankruptcy law. He is the Director of the AIDA Europe Research Studies on Insurance Law and Regulation that is the first book series of its kind and area of specialization. Pierpaolo Marano currently sits on the executive committee of AIDA Europe and chairs the Working party on the Distribution of Insurance Products. Moreover, Prof. Marano chairs the Scientific Committee of AIDA Europe, and he is a Collaborating Expert at the Geneva Association as Program Director Evolving Liability. He is serving as an associate editor of the European Insurance Law Review, Assicurazioni, International Journal of Finance, Insurance and Risk Management, and Journal of Accounting, Finance and Auditing Studies.
